This uplifting memoir is a compelling account of survival by a young boy during the time of chaos and uncertainty that was Europe during the years 1942 to 1956. Bruno's first cries competed with the eerie sound of air raid sirens as he is born in 1942. Separated from his mother, Edith, he becomes a refugee traveling with his grandmother, Helene, as they flee Danzig before the approaching Red Army. As a young child, he experiences the claustrophobia of bomb shelters, the nerve-racking sounds of exploding bombs and gun fire, the screams of the wounded, and the stench of death. For the starving refugees and retreating soldiers, soup kitchens represent a welcome sign of humanity. Bruno's mother served a short term as an SS guard at a concentration camp and ends up in the city of Hanover in Northern Germany. When the war

came to a sudden end in April 1945, Germans learned what it meant to be conquered. Russian guards controlled the villages and Communist propaganda was expounded to children as young as kindergarteners. Bruno found a new home in Saxony in East Germany with a clean warm bed and the love and affection of his grandmother. But his happiness is short lived when his mother returns in 1947 to take him away to live with her and his stepfather. Bruno is abused at home and bullied at school. But Against All Odds, he survives and learns to become the man he wants to be. At seventy years old, Alex Jankowski wrote this book to make peace with the past. Though it's his memoir, the names have been changed.

From NPR correspondent Keith O' Brien comes this thrilling Young Readers' edition of the untold story about pioneering women, including Amelia Earhart, who fought to compete against men in the high-stakes national air races of the 1920s and 1930s--and won. In the years between World War I and World War II, airplane racing was one of the most popular sports in America. Thousands of fans flocked to multiday events, and the pilots who competed in these races were hailed as heroes. Well, the male pilots were hailed. Women who flew planes were often ridiculed by the press, and initially they weren't invited to race. Yet a group of women were determined to take to the sky--no matter what. With guts and grit, they overcame incredible odds both on the ground and in the air to pursue their dreams of flying and racing planes. Fly Girls follows the stories of five remarkable women: Florence Klingensmith, a high school dropout from North Dakota; Ruth Elder, an Alabama housewife; Amelia Earhart, the most famous, but not necessarily the most skilled; Ruth Nichols, a daughter of Wall Street wealth who longed to live a life of her own; and Louise Thaden, who got her start selling coal in Wichita. Together,

they fought for the chance to race against the men--and in 1936 one of them would triumph in the toughest race of all. Complete with photographs and a glossary, *Fly Girls* celebrates a little-known slice of history wherein tenacious, trail-blazing women braved all obstacles to achieve greatness. Tom Hartley, 17, fights for survival, orphaned and alone on sixty thousand acres of Queensland cattle property. "Kind" Kit helps him escape being put into Care, repairs the house, then enslaves him. He is a willing pupil of a barmaid and practices with the girl sent to help him. He fights off a depraved land grabber and joins the army in 1942 resisting Japanese in Singapore. Aided by three soldiers, two pretty girls and an Indonesian boy, they wipe out an airfield and cause mayhem behind enemy lines. He must get vital war plans 3,000 miles to Australia in spite of a traitor. Action comes thick and fast; a mix of tragedy, impossible hurdles and a touch of Romance. The final turn of the screw awaits Tom on his return, as the bank manager goes off with his savings and traps him to await his fate. When struggling waitress Melody Dylan gives a handsome, lonely stranger a simple gift she has no clue her life is about to take a drastic turn. The stranger ends up being Clay Powers, a famous UFC heavyweight fighter. Clay's large build and dangerous fists have always intimidated. People in his hometown keep their distance and Clay is fine with that. Everything changes when a new waitress at the local diner buys him a piece of pie on Thanksgiving. Touched by the gesture when it's obvious she can barely afford to survive, her warm smile and lush body churn up powerful feelings that leave Clay wanting more from her than pie. Melody is running from her past and the small, country town of Garnet is the perfect hiding place. With an ex-husband after her and scars from her abusive marriage etched deep, the last thing she expects is to fall for a man who makes a living with his fists, but she can't resist Clay or the tender connection they share. Finding love in the most unlikely of places, the passion is undeniable, but Clay and Melody know their haunted pasts and unpredictable futures leave the odds stacked against them. Today is Sunday, June 17, 2007. Father's Day. Naturally, the obligatory, carefully selected cards, phone calls, and small gifts arrived from the children and grandchildren. Best wishes for Father's Day were also the first words in the morning from Heide, my wife of 54 years, although for many

years I had made the comment: "I am not your father." But, in the frame of my life's experiences throughout the 20th century, as I intend to summarize them over the next few years, the 17 of June has much deeper significance. This was the day in 1953 when we finally fled from our life of oppression which had lasted 20 years. While most Australian unions have been in existence since at least the early twentieth century the UFU was only registered in Queensland in 1976.
